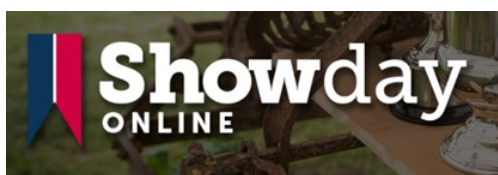

A number of Agricultural Societies have reported that some dog exhibitors have been abusive to show society staff, particularly when asked to produce passes or when asked to pay an entry fee for persons not in possession of passes. Such behaviour is totally unacceptable.
